HISTORY IN THE MAKING, PITCH BY PITCH

Legend's Baseball was founded in 2009 when David Klein, an undrafted catcher, wrapped up his academic obligations with UCSB, secured his degree, and retired from his role as a Gaucho backstop. With laser-like focus, David set out to create his own collegiate summer team and cutting edge, youth baseball camp.

EARLY DAYS

The Menlo Park Legends collegiate team played their first games at Menlo-Atherton High School and headquartered the first 3-week youth baseball camp at Red Morton Community Center. With camps now scattered throughout the Bay area, Legends Baseball has certainly grown by leaps and bounds!

The inaugural season included a 30-game schedule and, as word of the team grew, more talented players found their way onto the Legend's roster. Soon, the competition included some of the toughest teams in the state battling the Legends through exciting 45-50 game schedules that ran from early June and ending in late July.

In 2012, the Menlo Park Legends were added to the California Collegiate League, widely acknowledged as the most competitive league in California, if not on the entire West Coast.

The Legends quickly gained notoriety as a consistently formidable foe, with a roster packed with game changers, and hard-nosed players. The Legend's friendly home field confines include(ed) Menlo College, Canada College, Menlo-Atherton HS and Baylands Field in Palo Alto.

LEGACY OF GREATNESS

From 2009 until 2016, the Legends have had players drafted 8 years in a row. All in all, that's 50 players playing pro ball that have been touched by the program. This elite group includes 3 Olympians (Alon Leichman, and DJ Sharabi), as well as 3 Major Leaguers (Tyler Ivy, Zac Grotz, and Mark Mathias).

LEGACY TO BE WRITTEN

After a 5 year hiatus, the Legends brought collegiate baseball to the Peninsula once again in 2022, making the playoffs in their first year back. If you are an aspiring young collegiate ballplayer looking to write your own legacy in the summer of '23, to develop your skills, get that 4 year college or pro deal of your dreams, and/or prepare yourself for the big battles of Fall, we invite you to become legendary with us.

Cost

\$1500 (\$500 deposit + \$500 installments on March 1 and May 1)

Availability of work/Camps

All players are given the option to work Legends Youth Summer Camps during the day and will be paid \$600/week.

NICK WHITE: HEAD COACH

After finishing his playing career in 2013, White decided to pursue coaching at Monterey Peninsula Community College where he was a hitting, catching and strength coach for 3 seasons. In 2016 he became the graduate assistant for San Jose State University, where he worked with players from every position with an emphasis on catching.

In 2017, Nick White was hired as the Head Assistant Coach/ Recruiting Coordinator for Menlo College (NAIA). Although hitting and catching are his specialty, he was the head pitching coach for the 2017 season. White is also the founder and Head Coach for Menlo's JV baseball program. In his five years at Menlo College he was the head hitting, catching and pitching coach as well as 3B / 1B coach and head recruiting coordinator.

In 2022, White took the assistant coaching position at San Francisco State where he will be responsible for catchers and hitters.
